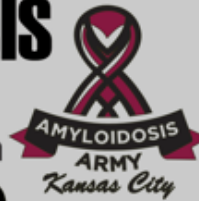

<u>Senate Bill 871</u>	Modifies the Pregnancy-Associated Mortality Review Board	Sent to governor on SB 999.
<u>Senate Bill 872</u>	Authorizes a sales tax exemption for supplies needed to care for infants.	Passed by Economic and Workforce Development
<u>Senate Bill 873</u>	Authorizes a tax credit for providing housing to victims of domestic violence.	Passed by Progress and Development
