Neighbor,

I want to wish everybody a happy and safe Thanksgiving! We all must do our part to minimize the spread of this potentially deadly COVID-19 virus which just this past weekend took the lives of two more of the Kansas City Fire Department's heroic employees – Captain Robert "Bobby" Rocha and Communication Specialist/Paramedic Scott Davidson. Flags will be flown at half-staff at all fire stations throughout Missouri and at all government buildings on the Missouri side of the metropolitan area on Saturday, November 28, and Monday, November 30, to honor them by order of Governor Mike Parson. You can scroll down to read the governor's comments about their selfless service. Billy Birmingham, a KCFD emergency medical technician, also lost his life due to the virus in April. He was the first known first responder in Missouri to die from the virus. Turning to legislative matters, the Missouri Senate Appropriations Committee is scheduled to meet Tuesday, December 1, to consider the \$1.28 billion supplemental spending bill passed by the House 133-4 on November 9. That bill appropriates federal stimulus funds allocated to

Missouri to assist the state in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and also includes \$2 million to implement the new statewide pretrial witness protection program created by bipartisan legislation I co-sponsored. I hope when the entire Senate convenes later December 1 that it promptly will approve this vitally needed funding and send it to the governor for his signature to become law. If the Senate amends the measure it will come back to the House for consideration of the changes. The House is tentatively scheduled to convene the week of December 7.

Governor Parson Announces Launch of New COVID-19 Vaccine Website for Missourians

(JEFFERSON CITY, MO) – As research and development of multiple COVID-19 vaccines continue to show promising safety and effectiveness findings, Governor Mike Parson today announced the launch of a new vaccine website for Missouri residents.

<u>MOStopsCOVID.com</u> provides Missourians with information regarding the safety of the vaccines, research and production processes, and when they may be eligible for vaccination. The website will also offer additional functionality as vaccines become available.

"It's been remarkable to learn about the work that has been going on for many months now among scientists and researchers, many of whom are right here in Missouri," **Governor Parson** said. "The most important thing we've learned about the accelerated development process is that steps have not been eliminated but are instead occurring simultaneously. Safety is not being sacrificed, and it's important for Missourians to understand this."

The new website includes answers to common questions Missouri

<u>residents</u> may have, such as when they will be able to receive the vaccine and how well it works. It also clarifies <u>misinformation</u> that citizens may have heard

about the vaccines.

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) and partners across the state continue to make preparations in advance of a vaccine arrival, which is anticipated to occur prior to the end of 2020. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices has identified the purposes of a COVID-19 vaccine as:

- 1. Decrease death and serious disease,
- 2. Preserve functioning of society,
- 3. Reduce extra burden that COVID-19 is having on people already facing disparities, and
- 4. Increase the chance for everyone to enjoy health and well-being.

A vaccine will initially become available in a limited quantity once it is proven safe and effective, approved for <u>Emergency Use Authorization (EUA)</u> by the FDA, and when the <u>Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)</u> has provided its recommendations on the use of the vaccines.

In August, a large group of more than 75 state team members, 10 Missouri National Guardsmen, and 50 federal and local partners began working together to develop Missouri's <u>COVID-19 vaccine response plan</u>. The plan was finalized and submitted to the CDC in October.

"Missouri got a very early start preparing for vaccinations because we think it's our best path to getting to a better place," **DHSS Director Dr. Randall Williams** said. "This process is one that has continued to evolve, and we are committed to providing Missourians with the information they need as quickly as we can provide it. Information is empowering, and personal choices made during this public health emergency can positively impact yourself, those around you, and your entire community."

Governor Parson Orders Flags to Fly Half-Staff in Honor of Kansas City Fire Department Communication Specialist / Paramedic Scott Davidson

(JEFFERSON CITY, MO) – Today, Governor Mike Parson ordered U.S. and Missouri flags be flown at half-staff at every fire station in the state of Missouri, the Fire Fighters Memorial in Kingdom City, and all government buildings in Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte counties on Saturday, November 28, 2020, in honor of Kansas City Fire Department Communication Specialist/Paramedic Scott Davidson.

After a valiant fight, Communication Specialist/Paramedic Davidson died in the line of duty on November 22, 2020, following exposure to coronavirus while serving in his capacity as a firefighter.

"For more than 18 years, Communication Specialist/Paramedic Davidson served with the Metropolitan Ambulance Services Trust (MAST) and the Kansas City Missouri Fire Department. He served with a calming strength that gave others hope in the midst of difficult times," **Governor Parson** said. "We are thankful for the sacrifices of the brave emergency responders who risk their own lives to protect the lives and property of their fellow citizens. Communication Specialist/Paramedic Davidson's strong and true service will never be forgotten."

(JEFFERSON CITY, MO) – Today, Governor Mike Parson ordered U.S. and Missouri flags be flown at half-staff at every fire station in the state of Missouri, the Fire Fighters Memorial in Kingdom City, and all government buildings in Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte counties on Monday, November 30, 2020, in honor of Kansas City Fire Department Captain Robert "Bobby" Rocha.

After a brave fight, Captain Rocha died on Saturday, November 21 as a result of COVID-19 that he contracted this month while serving in his capacity as a firefighter.

"Throughout his 29-year career with the Kansas City Fire Department, Captain Robert Rocha lived by the highest ideals of the fire service – the safety of others, professionalism, teamwork, and sacrifice," **Governor Parson** said. "The COVID-19 pandemic did not change Captain Rocha's commitment to protecting others, as he and thousands of Missouri's first responders continue to bravely and selflessly put their lives on the line to respond to emergency calls. We will never forget Captain Rocha's faithful, noble service."

The extension of this benefit, effective beginning September 1, ensures children remain safe and supervised during the school day and supports working parents to meet the demands of their jobs and stay employed

South KC Mobile Food Pantries

With so many people out of work due to the coronavirus pandemic, a growing number of families in south Kansas City are being forced to rely on community food pantries such as Community Assistance Council's to have enough to eat.

Fortunately, Harvesters (the community food network) brings the semi-truck that serves as its mobile food pantry to five sites in south Kansas City monthly to distribute fresh produce and other healthy food to families in need. The sites are:

Center District Warehouse, 8701 Holmes Rd., from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. the second Friday of each month. Persons should go to the entrance to the Center Administrative Office and drive through the bus parking lot to the warehouse where volunteers will load the food. Persons should take the Troost Ave exit. The event is sponsored by the Center Education Foundation in partnership with the Center School District.

Evangel Church, 1414 E. 103rd St., from 7 to 8:30 a.m. the second Saturday of the month. Persons may remain in their vehicles, and food will be brought to them.

Ruskin High School, 7000 E. 111th St., from 4 to 5:30 p.m. the third Thursday of the month. Vehicles should line up on Ruskin Way on the east side of the school, and food will be loaded in the vehicles when they reach the school by staff and student volunteers. This event is sponsored by the school and Community Assistance Council.

Colonial Presbyterian Church, 9500 Wornall Rd., with registration beginning at 8 a.m. and food distribution running from about 8:30 to 10 a.m. on the third

Saturday of the month. Families are asked to bring two cardboard boxes for volunteers to put the food in.

Center High School, 8715 Holmes Rd., from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. as long as food is left on the third Saturday of the month. The event is sponsored by Three Trails Community church in partnership with the Center School District.

UNEMPLOYMENT

How to File?

If you're eligible, you'll <u>need</u> the following:

- 1. Your Social Security number;
- 2. Any amount you were paid in the past week, before taxes and deductions;
- 3. The name and mailing address of each job you worked in the past 18 months;
- 4. The dates you started and ended work at each of those jobs.

If this is your first time filing for unemployment please watch <u>this video</u> on unemployment basics. Visit <u>uinteract.labor.mo.gov</u>, create an account and file your claim. If your job loss is related to coronavirus issues, make sure to check a box that says "COVID-19" in your application to waive a requirement to search for a new job amid the crisis.

Missouri provides benefits for up to 20 weeks, which can be extended to 33 weeks under the federal provisions.

The state will pay you up to \$320 per week, and the federal government will provide \$600 on top of whatever you get from the state for each week you're on umployment prior to July 31.

Benefits can be paid within 22 days unless there is an issue with your eligibility, which on average can take 4-6 weeks to resolve.

You should continue filing weekly requests for payment even if you have not yet received benefits.
