

HB 1242- Modifies provisions relating to juvenile court proceedings




HOUSE MOVES TO EXEMPT STIMULUS CHECKS FROM STATE TAX

The House of Representatives on April 7 granted first-round approval on a voice vote to legislation that would exempt the recent federal stimulus payments – and any additional such checks that Missourians might receive in the future – from being

subject to state income taxes. A second, recorded vote is required to advance the bill to the Senate.

Because the purpose of federal stimulus payments is to immediately inject money into the economy through increased individual spending, it has long been the practice for Missouri lawmakers to exempt such payments from state taxation in order to maximize the economic benefit. The tax exemption measure is House Bill 991.

Missouri joins other states not planning to mandate vaccine passports

Gov. Mike Parson announced Missouri will not mandate coronavirus vaccine passports, joining several other states in opposition of the credentials.

The passport would be used to show confirmation that a person has been vaccinated against the coronavirus.

During a Fox News interview, Parson said, "we're never gonna do that in the state of Missouri. We're never gonna have a mandate, a vaccine passport in this state."

However, Parson said Missourians are welcome to carry a vaccine card.

"That's called freedom, it's called individual rights. But it's not the government's place to do that," he said.

Rep. Richard Brown, a Democrat from Jackson County who represents South Kansas City said the vaccine cards could be helpful but should not be mandated.

"I agree why and understand we need to have vaccine passports for public health and public safety I think it's a good idea but I don't think mandatory vaccine passports is a good idea," Brown said.

The Biden administration has said it does not plan to require Americans to carry a vaccination credential.

Some government officials have raised privacy concerns over the concept of a vaccine passport saying that it could keep too much private, health data in one place.

Leaders in several other states like Florida, Texas, Georgia, Tennessee and Nebraska have also shown said they will not mandate vaccine passports.

Since last week, GOP governors from Texas and Florida have signed executive orders prohibiting various agencies from requiring the use of vaccine passports.

Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp said he was opposed to state-mandated vaccine passports on Tuesday. And Nebraska Gov. Pete Ricketts said in a tweet last month that Nebraska won't use vaccine passports or participate in the program.

SUBJECT: Reward Increase – 9 Year Old Dominic Young Homicide

KANSAS CITY, MO --- The Kansas City, Missouri Police Department and the Greater KC Crime Stoppers TIPS Hotline continue to seek information in the January 20, 2018 homicide of 9 year old Dominic Young Jr. at 71 Highway and Emanuel Cleaver II Blvd.

Dominic Young Jr. was apparently hit by a stray gunshot while occupying a vehicle driven by his father and died as a result of his injuries. Dominic, his father and brother were en route to Grandview at the time. The vehicle driven by Dominic's father was hit by gunshots from other vehicles apparently engaged in a gunfight according to statements.

KCPD found a possible crime scene near the intersection where the father said the shooting happened. When the father arrived home in Grandview, Dominic was not responsive. Grandview police initially responded to the father's home and found the boy in critical condition. He was later pronounced dead at a hospital.

A number of community leaders and organizations including State Representative Richard Brown, Mayor Pro Tem Kevin McManus, former City Councilmen Scott Taylor, Scott Wagner, John Sharp; the City of KCMO and Concord Fortress of Hope Church (Pastor Ron Lindsay) have come forward to increase the existing reward in the case up to \$30,000.00. Those leaders are available for comment in regard to the case.
